Kneel

O SACRED BANQUET, in which Christ becomes our food, the memory of his Passion is celebrated, the soul is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.


- ♥. You gave them bread from heaven.

Compline begins with the following verse and response. The celebrant, making the sign of the Cross sings, "O God come to my assistance," and the congregation, likewise making the sign of the Cross, then joins in:

CONFESS to almighty God, to blessed Mary ever-virgin, to blessed Dominic our Father, and to all the saints, and to you my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned through my own fault: in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do. I beseech you to pray for me.



PSALMODY

After the cantor begins the antiphon, all join in. Then the cantor sings the first line of the psalm according to the given psalm tone. The right side of the church joins in for the second line of the couplet. The left side of the church sings the second couplet in a similar way. The two sides of the church continue to alternate while singing the psalm. All bow for the lines, "Glory to the Father..." and rise at, "as it was in the beginning..."



PSALM 91Safe in God's Sheltering Care

He who dwells in the shelter of **the** Most High * and abides in the shade of the **al**mighty. says to the **Lord**: "My refuge, * my stronghold, my God in whom I trust.

With length of life I **will** content him; * I shall let him see my sav**ing** power.




RESPONSORY

COLLECT

For Sundays:

For other days:

Lord, we beg you to visit this house and banish from it all the deadly power of the enemy.† May your holy angels dwell here to keep us in peace, * and may your blessing be upon us always. We ask this through Christ, our Lord.

Compline ends with the antiphons "Salve, Regina" in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary and "O Lumen Ecclesiae" in honor of S. Dominic.
