



Let us pray.








Al-le-lu-ia.

PSALMODY

Psalm 16

God is my portion, my inheritance

The cantor intones the first two lines of the psalm. "Side I" is the same side of the church as the cantor. "Side II" is the opposite side.

Side I: Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you. †
I say to the Lord: "You are my God. *
My happiness lies in you alone."

Side II: He has put into my heart a marvelous love * for the faithful ones who dwell in his land.

- Side I: Those who choose other gods increase their sorrows. †
 Never will I offer their offerings of blood. *
 Never will I take their name upon my lips.
- Side II: O Lord, it is you who are my portion and cup; * it is you yourself who are my prize.
- Side I: The lot marked out for me is my delight: * welcome indeed the heritage that falls to me!
- Side II: I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel, * who even at night directs my heart.
- Side I: I keep the Lord ever in my sight: * since he is at my right hand, I shall stand firm.
- Side II: And so my heart rejoices, my soul is glad; * even my body shall rest in safety.
- Side I: For you will not leave my soul among the dead, * nor let your beloved know decay.
- Side II: You will show me the path of life, †
 the fullness of joy in your presence, *
 at your right hand happiness for ever.

Bow during the first two lines of the doxology in honor of the Trinity.







Ŋ. Let us pray.


Lord God, send peaceful sleep to refresh our tired bodies. May your help always renew us and keep us strong in your service. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
